The Road Captains and I have instituted some New Group Riding Practices you should be aware of: > We now have 2 Sweep Road Captains.... > If a rider falls out of the formation, DO NOT move up or cross over in the formation to fill the gap. That gap will be automatically filled at the next stop as the bikes pull forward in the formation..... Any questions you may have about Group Riding you can: > ask me or any Road Captain at any time..... > ask me during the monthly General Meeting..... > ask before a ride during the Safety Briefing, the Lead Road Captain for the ride conducts the briefing..... Always Remember Our Chapter Motto- "RIDE.....To Ride Another Day "

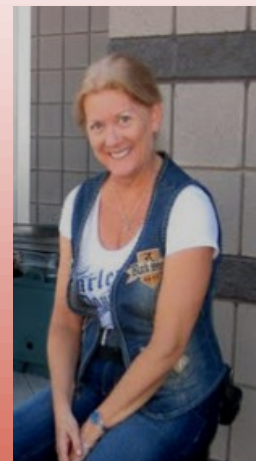
